I urge you to return TMI-1 to service without delay. There has been no evidence whatsoever of any damage to TMI-1 as a result of the accident at unit #2 and, therefore, no justifiable reason to keep it inoperative. The future of nuclear power in this nation rests in your hands. This all comes at a time when energy independence is recognized as more important than ever before. The United States simply cannot afford to remove the nuclear option from our energy future.
