Dear Madame/Sir,

I am a researcher who uses small amounts of ³H and ¹⁴C in basic medical research. The changes proposed in The Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (10 CFR, Part 20.305) were detailed in the Federal Register, <u>45</u>(197):67019 (October 8, 1980). The changes would facilitate disposal of very small amounts of these tadionuclides contained in scintillation vials and animal carcasses. I strongly support the changes for two reasons. First, they would lower the cost of disposal for a significant portion of my research. Second, (and most important), they would not, in my opinion, present a danger to human health.
