

Dear Mr. Chilk:

The State of California has reviewed the proposed rule, Standards for Protection Against Radiation, amending regulations to permit licensees greater leeway in disposing of liquid scintillation media and animal carcasses containing tracer levels of hydrogen-3 (tritium) or carbon-14, Docket No. PR 20 (45 FR 67018), which was submitted through the Office of Planning and Research (State Clearinghouse) in the Governor's Office.

The State's review, which fulfills the requirements of Part II of Office of Management and Budget Circular A-95, was coordinated with the Departments of Fish and Game, Food and Agriculture, Health, and Water Resources; and the Air Resources, Solid Waste Management, and State Water Resources Control Boards.
