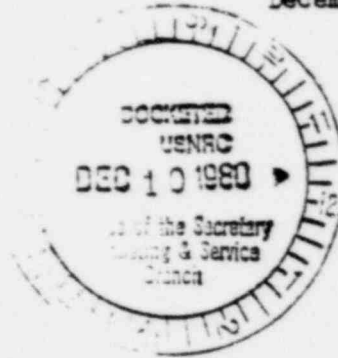

Dear Sirs,

Radiation-contaminated smelted alloys cannot be exempted from licensing requirements! I am terribly frightened of the proposed exemption!

Please do not approve this proposal!

There has not been enough research done to indicate that enriched uranium or technetium-99 contaminated alloys are safe (read: are not cancer-causing). Cancer has an incubation period of 5-50 years, and it takes but one damaged cell, hit by one radioactive atom, to cause cancer. We are subjecting our children to an unnecessary and devastating risk. Please! Don't allow this to happen.
