

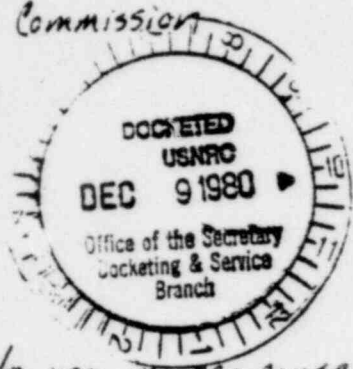

Dear Secretary;

I am writing to you in response to the proposed amendments which were released to the press on October 27, 1980 under the heading: "NRC Proposes Licensing Requirement Exemption For Contaminated Smelted Alloys." I strongly oppose such amendments. The health and safety of every woman, man, and child would be in jeopardy if such amendments were passed. Although I am totally aware of the power of economic profits, I am always amazed and angered that the Commission trivializes the imminent danger paralleling nuclear power.
