Inspection Report 050-155/76-03, which was transmitted by letter dated
February 5, 1976 contained two infractions. A response detailing corrective
action taken or planned was requested. This letter provides the requested
response.

Infraction

The requalification program did not include preplanned lectures in those areas
where results of the 1974 annual operator exams indicated an emphasis in scope
and depth of coverage was needed.

Corrective Action

The 1974 and 1975 annual exams have been reviewed for areas of review. These
areas have been identified as (1) Features of Facility Design, (2) Several Op-
erating Characteristics, (3) Radiation Control and Safety and (4) Fuel Handling
and Core Parameters. Material from these areas will be scheduled into the future
weekly sessions. It may be interesting to note that the low areas of concern
in the 1974 exams were not repeated in the results of the 1975 exams.

The annual exams will be reviewed, overall and by category, to determine areas
of concern. These shall be included in future training sessions.

Inclusion of 1974 and 1975 areas of concern in the annual exams will be included
in April 1976 class sessions, as well as all future sessions.

Infraction

Written examinations were not provided during the one classroom day per five
weeks portion of the 1973-1975 retraining cycle, to determine the operators
knowledge of subjects covered and to provide a basis for evaluating their know-
ledge of abnormal and emergency procedures.

Corrective Action

Corrective action taken is to have written and/or oral evaluations included with a minimum of every other classroom date. This should avoid any further noncompliance with this item. Evaluations will be included with each weekly lesson plan as developed.
