Dear Mr. Shea:

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This letter is in response to the letter from your office dated November 21, 1980, requesting Executive Branch views as to whether issuance of an export license in accordance with the application hereinafter described would be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States and whether the proposed export meets the applicable criteria of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended by the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act of 1978:

NRC No. XSNM01765 — Application by Transnuclear, Inc. for authorization to export to Switzerland, via the Federal Republic of Germany, 741.714 kilograms of U-235 contained in 20,893.34 kilograms of uranium enriched to a maximum of 3.55 percent plus .0355 kilogram of U-235 contained in 1 kilogram uranium enriched to 3.55 percent as sampling material. The enriched uranium in the form of uranium hexafluoride will be shipped to RBU-Reaktor Brennlement Union GmbH, Hanau, FRG, for conversion into UO2 and manufacture of fuel elements for two reloads of the Beznau II Power Reactor.

The proposed export to the intermediate consignee in the FRG for conversion and fabrication would take place pursuant to the Additional Agreement for Cooperation Between the United States and the European Atomic Energy Community (EURATOM) as confirmed in a letter from the Delegation of the Commission of the European Communities, a copy of which is enclosed. EURATOM has adhered to the provisions of its Agreement for Cooperation with the United States.

The proposed export to the ultimate consignee in Switzerland would take place pursuant to the Agreement for Cooperation Between the United States and Switzerland, as confirmed in a letter from the Embassy of Switzerland, a copy of which is enclosed.

The Executive Branch has reviewed the application and concluded that the requirements of the Atomic Energy Act, as amended by the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act of 1978, have been met and that the proposed export will not be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States. A detailed analysis for EURATOM and Switzerland was submitted November 27, 1979 for NRC application No. XU08427. In view of Executive Order 12193.

extending the duration of the period specified in the first proviso to Section 126a(2) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, to March 10, 1981, that detailed analysis remains valid. There has been no other material change in circumstances since that submission for either EURATOM or Switzerland.

On the basis of the foregoing, the Executive Branch recommends that the license be issued.
