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Gentlemen:

This refers to the routine inspection conducted by Messrs. J. E. Konklin and F. C. Hawkins of this office on January 21-23, 1981, of activities at the Perry Nuclear Plant Project, Units 1 and 2, authorized by NRC Construction Permits No. CPPR-148 and No. CPPR-149 and to the discussion of our findings with M. R. Edelman and G. W. Groscup and others of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The enclosed copy of our inspection report identifies areas examined during the inspection. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations, and interviews with personnel.

During this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in noncompliance with NRC requirements, A3 described in the enclosed Appendix A. As a result of these findings, on January 27, 1981 we issued an Immediate Action Letter confirming the stop work imposed by you on Metalweld, Inc., the site safety-related coatings contractor. Your letter of January 26, 1981 details the corrective actions you are taking in response to the NRC inspection findings. No further written response to the findings of this inspection is required.

In accordance with Section 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the NRC's Public Document Room, except as follows. If this report contains information that you

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or your contractors believe to be proprietary, you must apply in writing to this office, within twenty-five days of the date of this letter, to withhold such information from public disclosure. The application must include a full statement of the reasons for which the information is considered proprietary, and should be prepared so that proprietary information identified in the application is contained in an enclosure to the application.

We will gladly discuss any questions you have concerning this inspection.
