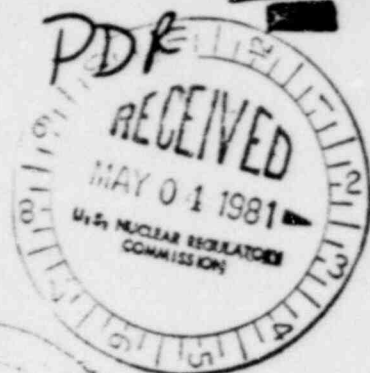

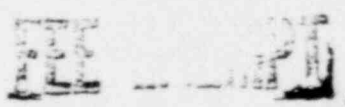

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CHAPTER 8


ANIMALS & FOWL

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any horse, mule, jack ass or cattle of any kind or description, any hog, pig, sheep or goat or rabbit, or any kind of poultry to house or to allow the same to run at large or to be staked out within the city limits of Edgemont. The person claiming possession, or who shall have charge of any such animal found running at large shall be deemed to be the owner thereof. This section shall not apply to stockyards or other places where livestock is kept temporarily for convenience. ORDINANCE NO. 63, REV.


SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to harbor or keep any animal which disturbs the peace by loud noises at any time of the day or night. SDCL-1967-9-29-3.

SECTION 3. Every person who violates section one shall be subject to a fine.

Original passage of this ordinance occurred in 1924. It has been in effect and continuously enforced for nearly sixty years. As mayor, I know of no current violations of this ordinance. Should a violation occur, I will do everything within my power as mayor to fully enforce this law.
