COMMONWEALTH EDISON COMPANY  
NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY  
OPERATING LICENSES

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 63 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-39, and Amendment No. 60 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-48 issued to the Commonwealth Edison Company (the licensee), which revised Technical Specifications for operation of Zion Station, Units 1 and 2 (the facilities) located in Zion, Illinois. The amendments are effective as of the date of issuance.

These amendments incorporate the requirements for implementation of the TMI-2 Lessons Learned Category "A" items. They specifically include the areas of emergency power supply requirements, valve position indication, instrumentation for inadequate core cooling, containment isolation, auxiliary feedwater systems, and shift technical advisor. The License Conditions require the implementation of programs to reduce leakage outside containment and to accurately determine airborne iodine concentrations.

The application for the amendments complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendments. Prior public notice of these amendments was not required since the amendments do not involve a significant hazards consideration.

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
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The Commission has determined that the issuance of these amendments will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4) an environmental impact statement or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of these amendments.
