Appendix B, Security Concerns:

During the period April 24 to May 23, 1978, an investigation was conducted concerning the falsification of patrol records and guard firearms qualification records by the guard service contractor at Dresden. The results of that investigation were discussed with Commonwealth Edison Management in a meeting held in the regional office on June 22, 1978. During this meeting, concerns disclosed as a result of the investigation, specifically relating to [redacted] were discussed.

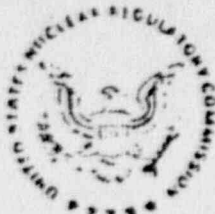
As a result of the current inspection, our concerns have increased. A review of records and discussions with site security personnel disclosed that the [redacted] is in excess of [redacted] based on the number of guards required by the guard contract. The inspection also disclosed that morale continues to be low. Many of the items of noncompliance disclosed during the inspection can be attributed to the failure of security personnel to follow established security procedures. We feel that unless steps are taken to reduce [redacted] the effectiveness of the security organization may be adversely affected.

Comments:

We acknowledge that a low average experience level of the station security personnel could contribute to errors and inefficient security program operations. A recent effort [redacted] within the security organization has included an increase of approximately 25% in guard pay levels. At the same time, security organization supervisory wages were substantially increased. The purpose of these increases is to improve the ability to attract and retain qualified security personnel.

Because of recent rapid increases in the number of security personnel required, facilities available are no longer adequate. A new security building, which includes lockers, shower facilities, aqua room, and office space for the security organization is scheduled for completion in 1979.

This refers to the inspection conducted by Messrs. J. L. Belanger, J. C. Howell and C. A. Schwan of this office on October 10-13 and 16-19, 1978, of activities at Dresden Nuclear Power Station, Units 1, 2 and 3, authorized by NRC Operating licenses No. DFR-2, No. DFR-19 and No. DFB-25 and to the discussion of our findings with Mr. E. Stephenson and other members of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The enclosed copy of our inspection report identifies areas examined during the inspection. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations, and interviews with personnel.

During this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in noncompliance with NRC requirements, as described in the enclosed Appendix A. The inspection showed that action had been taken to correct the identified noncompliance, and commitments were made during the above meeting to prevent recurrence. If your understanding of these commitments is different from that indicated in Paragraph 9 of the enclosed report, please advise this office within twenty days of your receipt of this letter.

Concerns noted during the inspection regarding the security organization are described in the enclosed Appendix B. We would appreciate your comments on the content of this Appendix within twenty days.
