In accordance with Environmental Technical Specification 2.4.4.2, the following occurrence is reported. The report was discussed with our Resident Inspector, Mr. D. A. Beckman, at approximately 1400 hours on May 29, 1981.

During routine review of Radcon surveillance records for the period of May 27 through May 29, 1981, it was discovered that a sample of the gaseous waste discharge path was not taken on May 28, as required with the radiation monitor, [RM-GW-108A, B], out of service. The required samples were taken on May 27 and 29.

The health and safety of the general public was not jeopardized since no gaseous waste releases occurred during the period. Any additional information or corrective action will be included in the follow-up report.
