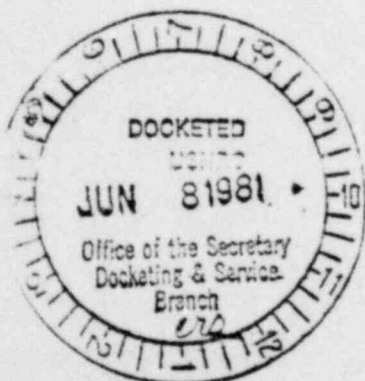
Dear Congressman Goodling;
