

NRC No. XCOM0515 — Application by Westinghouse Electric Corporation for authorization to export to Spain \$90,000 worth of nuclear fuel assembly components for use by the Empresa Nacional Del Uranio, S.A. (ENUSA) in training personnel in the manufacture of fuel assemblies.

It is the judgment of the Executive Branch that the export contemplated will not be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States, and is consistent with the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended by the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act of 1978.

As stated in my letter to you dated January 31, 1979, it is the view of the Executive Branch that the generic assurances provided by the Spanish Government by letter to U.S. Embassy, Madrid, January 23, 1979, meet the criteria under Section 109 B. for exports of reactor components by confirming that the items specified in Appendix A of 10 CFR 110 will be included under the definition, "material including equipment and devices" cited in Article X of the 1974 U.S.-Spain Agreement for Cooperation, and are therefore subject to the guarantees in that article, including: 1) IAEA safeguards; 2) no nuclear explosive use; and 3) no retransfer without prior U.S. consent.

On the basis of the foregoing, the Executive Branch recommends that the license be issued.
