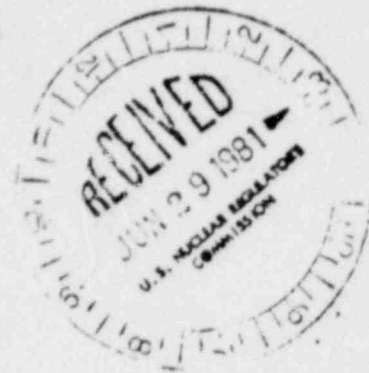

This refers to the routine safety inspection conducted by Miss J. McGinness of this office on May 19, 1981, of activities authorized by NRC License No. 29-01558-01 and to the discussions of our findings held by Ms. McGinness with yourself at the conclusion of the inspection.

The area examined during the inspection was limited to a review of the present status of the license and your plans for future use of licensed materials. It is our understanding from these discussions that your program has been inactive since November 1979 and you have not acquired any byproduct materials at your office since that time. Further, you have no plans for immediate use of byproduct materials under this license.

Within the scope of this inspection, no items of noncompliance were observed.
