In order for the record to reflect the current facts,
I wish to bring to your attention the incorrect data as
shown in the Environmental Statement.

It is stated that "The Applicant anticipates that a
portion of the property along the eastern shoreline of
the reservoir will be made available to a governmental or
regulatory agency for development into a public recreational
facility."

Texas Utilities Generating Company had offered Squaw
Creek Reservoir and park lands to Somervell County for
recreational uses. Following affirmative action and
acceptance in principal by the Somervell County Commissioners
Court of the offer by Texas Utilities, the Utility withdrew
the offer. Also, it is my understanding that the reservoir
and park acres will not be given to nor accepted by the
State of Texas.


