In response to your April 29, 1981 letter and, as provided to you via telephone by Thomas Fleming of my staff on May 20, 1981, the NRC staff condurs with the DOE's proposed method of disposal for small quantities of low level radioactively contaminated groundwater and stormwater that may be encountered during remedial actions at the Salt Lake City UMTRAP vicinity Thus, we also intend this concurrence as a modification to the formal NRC concurrence in the DOE's remedial action plan for the Salt Lake City Fire Station No. 1 vicinity property as provided by my letter to you of April 23, 1981. The method shall be as described below:

- Groundwater and stormwater, whether of small quantity or not, will be collected and sampled for grass alpha contamination.
- (2) Small quantities of groundwater and stormwater which do not contain more than 15 pCi/liter of gross alpha contamination (Utah Division of Health's Water Disposal Standard and EPA's Drinking Water Standard) will be directly discharged into the local storm sewers.
- (3) If the groundwater or stormwater contains more than 15 pCi/liter of gross alpha contamination, or is of significant quantity regardless of gross alpha contamination level, it will be transported to the Vitro Site by truck and sprayed on the existing tailings.

Mr. Dennis Dalley, Assistant Director, Utah Division of Environmental Health, Utah Department of Health, advised me by telephone on May 18, 1981 that the State of Utah is agreeable to this disposal method and that the State will monitor all DOE activities regarding any subsequent such disposals which may occur.
