Gentlemen:

This refers to the routine safety inspection conducted by Mr. R. J. Cook of this office on May 1-31, 1981, of activities at the Midland Nuclear Power Plant Construction Site authorized by NRC Construction Permits No. CPPR-81 and No. CPPR-82 and to the discussion of our findings with Mr. D. M. Turnbull and others of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The enclosed copy of our inspection report identifies areas examined during the inspection. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations, and interviews with personnel.

No items of noncompliance with NRC requirements were identified during the course of this inspection.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the Commission's regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the NRC's Public Document Room. If this report contains any information that you or your contractors believe to be exempt from disclosure under 10 CFR 9.5(a)(4), it is necessary that you (a) notify this office by telephone within seven (7) days from the date of this letter of your intention to file a request for withholding; and (b) submit within twenty-five (25) days from the date of this letter a written application to this office to withhold such information. Section 2.790(b)(1) requires that any such application must be accompanied by an affidavit executed by the owner of the information which identifies the document or part sought to be withheld, and which contains a full statement of the reasons on the basis which it is claimed that the information should be withheld from public disclosure. This section further requires the statement to address with specificity the considerations listed

in 10 CFR 2.790(b)(4). The information sought to be withheld shall be incorporated as far as possible into a separate part of the affidavit. If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified periods noted above, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the Public Document Room.

We will gladly discuss any questions you have concerning this inspection.

Inspection Summary

Inspection on May 1-31, 1981 (Report Nos. 50-329/81-13; 50-330/81-13)

Areas Inspected: Examination of site conditions; participation in a construction assessment team inspection; witness of Velsicol Chemical Company brine well sampling and soil boring activity. The inspection involved a total of 37 inspector-hours onsite by one NRC inspector including 9 inspector-hours onsite during off-shifts.

Results: No items of noncompliance or deviations were identified.
