Please read and consider the objections I have  
raised in the following letter to Mr. Joseph Hendrie, NRC.

Dear Mr. Hendrie:

This letter is an urgent plea that the NRC  
1) disapprove the proposed low power testing at Diablo Canyon  
2) decommission the Humboldt Bay nuclear power plant.

Both Diablo and Humboldt are situated near known  
earthquake faults. Both plants are located near large  
populations. The danger to human lives and surroundings  
is appalling should an accident of nature or man occur.

PG & E are profit making concerns. Their projects,  
investments, holdings and operations should not dictate  
the quality and very existence of life in the communities  
they serve.

Please consider the hypothetical local chemist  
down the road, whose business it is to mix volatile  
substances that have the potential to kill, contaminate  
and induce disease among the local populace. You, living  
nextdoor to him, would see to it that he close shop  
immediately, upon learning his hands are known to be  
shaky, and who knows when his energy factory may  
fly to the sky, taking you with it!

Accidents do happen at nuclear power plants.  
Earthquakes do occur on faults. Also, the disposal  
of nuclear wastes is still an unsolved problem.  
Please decommission Humboldt nuclear power plant  
and deny the low power test at Diablo.
