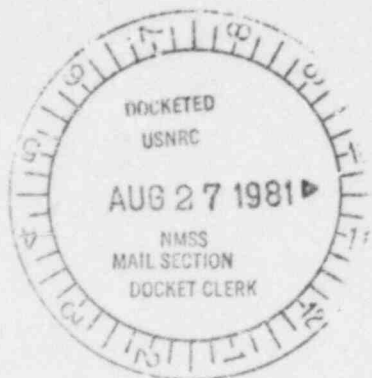

Additionally, this project has added Dr. Kenneth Nash to the research staff, whose training and experience has been reviewed and approved by the Radiological Advisory Committee.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that Item 6E, 7E, and 8E of the above license be amended to read as follows:

- 6E. Any special nuclear material.
- 7E. Any.
- 8E. 50 milligrams.
