INTERVENORS' MOTION FOR ADDITIONAL TIME TO IDENTIFY HYDROGEN CONTROL CONTENTIONS

Intervenors respectfully request that the Hearing Schedule (as adopted pursuant to the Board's Order of October 14, 1981) be modified to extend until November 21, 1981, the time within which to identify and propose contentions related to hydrogen control measures. In support of their application, Intervenors would show the Board that Applicant's Amendment No. 18 to the BFS PSAR was not delivered to the parties until October 22, 1981, thereby preventing all parties from having sufficient time to review this Amendment. Indeed, Applicant's attorneys have acknowledged the belated delivery and indicated their acquiesence to additional time if needed by the parties.
