Pursuant to Technical Specifications 3.18.1.B.3 of Appendix A, to Provisional Operating License No. DPR-13 for San Onofre Unit 1 and Section 3.12.1.C of Appendix A, to Facility Operating License Nos. NPF-10 and NPF-15 for Units 2 and 3 respectively, this special 30-day written report is submitted to identify the unavailability of leafy vegetable samples at the new vegetable gardens in San Clemente, recently added to San Onofre Radiological Environmental Monitoring Program (special report submitted to NRC dated September 21, 1989).

An investigation of the garden revealed that the 1989 Land Use Census had mistakenly reported presence of leafy vegetable garden residence in the city of San Clemente located at distances of 4.1 miles in the northwest of Units 2 and 3.

A visual inspection of the garden was conducted by Southern California Edison and the lack of leafy vegetables was confirmed by an interview with the resident users of the garden. Consequently, a representative fleshy vegetable replacement sample was obtained from San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station's present sampling location for local crops.
