SPECIAL ACTIVE PROCEDURES

Reference: SMUD to NRC Letter AGM/NUC 89-285, dated December 28, 1989,
"Modifications of the Rancho Seco Physical Security Plan, Operator
Training Program, and Emergency Plan"

Attention: George Knighton

As discussed with the NRC Project Manager for Rancho Seco, Mr. Steve Reynolds, the District is continuing its compliance with 10 CFR 55. Until the NRC approves exemptions that were requested in December, 1989 (see reference), Rancho Seco will continue to train its Licensed Operators on the various operating procedures as delineated in the regulations for licensed operator requalification. A considerable number of these procedures are currently inapplicable due to current plant conditions. However, due to the License Operator Requalification Training requirements, the District will maintain these procedures in a special active status. This special active status is the most recent version of the procedure with a stamped notice stating:

"DO Not Use Until Completing Biennial Review."

Procedures with this designation will remain in the Control Room for operator use to prepare for requalification exams. Those specially designated operating procedures will be appropriately controlled in accordance with Rancho Seco administrative procedures.
