McDonnell Douglas Corporation (MDC) requests that the subject license be amended to incorporate a personnel change on our Radiation Safety Committee. Our chairman unexpectedly announced his intention to resign effective 19 May 1989. In accordance with our administrative control procedure, Mr. D. F. Waters, Vice President, Human Resources, has appointed Miss Eileen A. O'Connor to be his representative on the Radiation Safety Committee (RSC).

Enclosure (1) is Miss O'Connor's resume of training and experience. Miss O'Connor's field of expertise is health physics. Currently, she is a Senior Health Physicist at McDonnell Aircraft Company where her full-time responsibility is health physics. She has served as our Associate Radiation Safety Officer for the past six months. Before coming to MDC, she served as a health physicist at the Corporate Office of Commonwealth Edison Company where she specialized in dosimetry. She also served as Radiation Chemistry Supervisor at Dresden Nuclear Power Station where she was responsible for implementing the company's radiation protection program.

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The Reference (a) management scheme previously provided for Miss O'Connor is obsolete. Miss O'Connor now reports directly to the Director of Safety, Health, and Food Operations, who in turn reports to the Vice-President. Human Resources (VPHR). That functional scheme may change in the future by the addition of a Manager, at which time Miss O'Connor may report to the VPHR through a Manager and a Director.

Miss O'Connor will continue to act as Associate Radiation Safety Officer while serving as the RSC chairperson. Therefore, in the event of my absence, Miss O'Connor will assume the Radiation Safety Officer's (RSO) responsibilities and authority per Ref (b). In accordance with Ref (c), the RSO will continue to act for the committee chairperson in her absence.

The duties, responsibilties, and authority of the committee, as detailed in Ref (d), have not changed.

We are still requesting approval of our Ref (e) license amendment application. In that letter, we requested that Mrs. Lisa R. Jenkins be approved as a Radiation Safety Committee principal. We also indicated that (1) all committee actions would require the concurrence of at least four of the seven voting principals; and (2) any four principals would have the authority on an interim basis to suspend or modify uses of radioactive material subject to review by the committee at its next meeting. Summarizing all of the above personnel changes, the voting principals and officers of the committee would include the following individuals:

Davis, Radiation Hardening Specialist Dr. J. Wayne Lanham, Biological Sciences Specialist Dr. Clarence J. Wolf, Radiation Chemistry Specialist
