Rather, in order to satisfy guidance published by NRC and DOE, we conducted a limited review to determine facial compliance with the 1990 milestone requirements.

All certifications received were judged to moet facial compliance and promptly forwarded to DOE in view of DOE's statutory obligation to make surcharge rebate determinations within 30 days of the milestone.
