NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Ryder Memorial Hospital Humacao, Puerto Rico Docket No. 030-19679 License No. 52-21026-01

During the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) inspection conducted on January 23, 1990, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C (1989), the violation is listed below:

Condition 13 of License Number 52-21026-01 states that the license is based on statements and representations cortained in the application dated March 30, 1982. Item 24 of the application requires that film badges and rings be worn and exchanged on a monthly basis.

Contrary to the above, an employee in the Nuclear Medicine Department had not been issued a film badge or ring from the day of employment on December 18, 1989, until January 23, 1990.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Ryder Memorial Hospital is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region II, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice. This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) admission or denial of the violation, (2) the reason for the violation if admitted, (3) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved, (4) the corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further violations, and (5) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order may be issued to show cause why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken.
