### SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN

# VIRGINIA POLYTECHNIC INSTITUTE AND STATE UNIVERSITY AND

THE U. S. NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION

- In Article III Consideration, the sum "\$ 674,078.97" is substituted for the sum "\$495,061.97".

### RESEARCH TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR Article A-I

- (a) The scope of work under this contract is unclassified and shall be in accordance with Contractor's proposal entitled, "Studies of the Pattern and Ages of Post-Metamorphic Faults and Other Crustal Elastic Anisotrophies in the Northern Piedmont of Virginia and North Carolina" dated 5/16/81.
  - Develop a three-dimensional geologic framework of part of the Central Virginia Seismic Zone in terms of: a) faults, and b) surfaces of appreciable rigidity contrast which may localize faulting.
  - Complete a regional study of the tector.ic framework of Triassic-2. Jurassic basins in Virginia and of the relation of this framework to historical seismicity.
  - Continue compilation and analysis of: a) structures, and b) crustal heterogeneity in elastic properties for Virginia and adjacent areas of North Carolina.
  - 4. Prepare a final report.
- (b) The Principal Investigator expects to devote the following approximate amount(s) of time to the contract work: Dr. Lynn Glover, III, Eleven percent (11%) of his time during the academic year. Dr. John K. Costain, Eleven percent (11%) of his time during the academic year.
