Hearings to determine whether TMI-1 should be allowed to resume operation and, if so, under what conditions, began on October 15, 1980. Because of the unique nature of the proceeding and the broad spectrum of issues under discussion, it is difficult to provide a definitive schedule for a decision at this time.

While we are, of course, concerned about financial impacts on consumers and stockholders, the NRC's prime responsibility is the assurance of public health and safety through a fair and thorough hearing and decision. The record on which the Commission will make a final decision will include findings and conclusions by the ASLB.

The staff is actively involved in the ongoing review of technical issues concerning the restart of Unit 1 and activities associated with the cleanup of Unit 2.
