This refers to the special inspection conducted by Dr. J. Glenn of this office on November 21, 1980, of activities authorized by NRC License No. 20-02215-01 and to the discussions of our findings held by Dr. Glenn with Messrs. Rogers and Evdokimoff of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and the conditions of your license. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, measurements made by the inspector, and observations by the inspector.

Our inspector also verified the steps you have taken to correct the items of noncompliance brought to your attention in the enclosure to our letter dated June 5, 1980. We have no further questions regarding your action at this time.

Based on the results of this inspection, it appears that one of your activities was not conducted in full compliance with MCC requirements, as set forth in the Notice of Violation, enclosed herewith Appendix A. This item of noncompliance has been categorized into the set of described in the Federal Register Notice (45 FR 66754) dated October 7
