

I have recently ordered one copy of your document NUREG/CR-0742.

I placed the order for your report thinking that it would provide me with useful information in discharging my responsibilities in my work as a shipper of radioactive material. After receiving NUREG/CR-0742 and reading it, I was very disappointed in the conclusions it reached and the way it presented it's information.

I did not purchase NUREG/CR-0742 to read about the Karen Silk-wood case. Suggestions that trucks carrying radioactive material be provided with a sign or placard that changes color when exposed to radiation are somewhat naive to say the least.

Furthermore, suggestions that truck drivers must "race" to burial grounds to dispose of nuclear waste before it dissolves their containers is an exaggeration of a small but solvable problem which is experienced with the disposal of any industrial waste.

I'm sorry that the NRC has published this document. It is without a doubt the poorest written NUREG document I have ever read.
