NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Cormission (the Comission) has issued Amendment No. 58 to Facility Operating License No. DFR-36, issued to Maine Yankee Atomic Power Company, which revised Technical Specifications for operation of the Maine Yankee Atomic Power Station (the facility) located in Lincoln County, Maine. The amendment is effective as of the date of issuance.

The amendment:

- 1) Revises the Technical Specifications to support the operation of the Maine Yankee Atomic Power Station at full rated power during Cycle 6.
- 2) Revises additional Appendix A Technical Specifications by:
 - a. incorporating changes required by our letter dated April 20, 1981 regarding redundant barrier isolation of the primary coolant system from the low pressure safety injection system,
 - b. incorporating changes to the reactor vessel fluence figures, and
 - c. incorporating changes in method of disabling the safety injection tank isolation valves and corresponding loop isolation valves in the open position.

The applications for the amendments comply with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since this amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

The Commission has determined that the issuance of this amendment will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4) an environmental impact statement or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this amendment.
