I am a concerned citizen who objects to the Limerick nuclear power construction. Philadelphia's citizens cannot be quickly and safely evacuated if there is a nuclear disaster at Limerick. The N.R.C. itself has said that reactors should be built at least 30 miles from major population centers. According to the N.R.C. Limerick

spot relative to population in the whole country. There are no provisions made for the evacuation of criminals and nursing homes, in the emergency evacuation plan.

The alternatives: A program of conservation by cutting energy waste, not service. Free audits to all homes and businesses to find energy leaks. Zero interest loans to home owners and renters, low-interest loans to businesses for insulation, weather stripping, storm windows, improving furnace efficiencies. Free inspection to guarantee weatherization has been done well. Free shower flow restrictors, water tank insulators, thermostats set-back to 125-130°. Additional power through

B hydro-stations on existing Schuylkill dams,
a trash-burning electric plant. Industries
which already generate steam, using it to gen-
erate electricity. Also (cogeneration), an un-
noticeable line voltage reduction; or con-
version of two oil plants to coal and
two additional small coal plants
with purchase of Berwick power. These
facts are from City of Phila. study by Dr.
Stephen Feldman Director, Energy center
Univ. of Penna. These alternatives will
benefit us all economically, make jobs
for the currently unemployed and also
contribute to our mental and physical
health. I hope you will give this letter due
consideration.
