NOTICE OF VIOLATION

As a result of the inspection conducted on April 21, 1981, and in accordance with the Interim Enforcement Policy, 45 FR 66754 (October 7, 1980), the following violation was identified:

10 CFR 71.5(a) "Transportation of licensed material" requires, in part, that transportation be made in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Department of Transportation in 49 CFR 170-189.

49 CFR 172.403 requires that each package of radioactive material, unless excepted, bear a Radioactive White I, Radioactive Yellow II or a Radioactive Yellow III label on two opposite sides.


Contrary to this requirement, on April 21, 1981, you transported a 55-gallon drum which did not have the required two Radioactive White I labels affixed to the opposite sides of the package.

This is a Severity Level VI Violation (Supplement V).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Interex Corporation is hereby required to submit to this office within thirty days of the date of this Notice, a written statement or explanation in reply, including: (1) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved; (2) corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further violations; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Under the authority of Section 182 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, this response shall be submitted under oath or affirmation. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending your response time.

The responses directed by this Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, PL 96-511.
