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MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

We have today furnished a copy of the Licensing Board's February 13, 1990, decision, LBP-90-9, 31 NRC ____, in this proceeding to the General Counsel of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The EPA is invited to file a brief <u>amicus curiae</u> expressing its views on the Licensing Board's decision.¹ That decision authorizes an amendment to the materials license held by the Kerr-McGee Chemical Corporation for its West Chicago Rare Earths Facility and permits Kerr-McGee permanently to dispose of some 376,400 cubic meters of radioactive thorium mill tailings and other contaminated materials on the West Chicago site. The State of Illinois and the City of West Chicago, Illinois, have filed notices of appeal from the Licensing Board's decision.

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Any brief in response to this invitation shall be due on either April 19, 1990 (when appellants' briefs are due), or May 21, 1990 (when appellee Kerr-McGee's brief is due), depending upon whether the EPA is in substantial agreement or disagreement with the Licensing Board's decision.²
