

RESPONSE OF GENERAL ELECTRIC CO.
TO PETITION OF THE NUCLEAR CONTROL INSTITUTE
ET AL. FOR LEAVE TO INTERVIEW
AND REQUEST FOR HEARING

On July 28, 1983, the Nuclear Control Institute, Federation of American Scientists, Union of Concerned Scientists, Greenpeace, U.S.A., Energy Research Foundation, and Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy petitioned the Nuclear Regulatory Commission for leave to intervene and for a public hearing in the captioned export license proceedings. On August 8, 1983, the U.S. Department of State responded to that Petition, urging the Commission to deny the Petition due to its failure to meet the standards for intervention or hearing set forth in subsections 304(b) and (c) of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act of 1978 (42 U.S.C. 2155a.) and 10 C.F.R. §110.84, the exclusive bases for granting intervention or a hearing concerning an application to the Commission for a license to

export nuclear equipment. Rather than burden the Commission with duplicative and lengthy filings in this matter, the General Electric Co., the applicant for License Nos. XCOM0020 and XCOM0460 (Docket Nos. 11000112 and 11002284, respectively), associates itself with the arguments^{*} made by the Department of State in its Response and, for the reasons stated therein, urges the Commission to deny the petitioners' request for intervention and a hearing.

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
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
