3. Class and Period of License Requested

Applicants request two class 103 construction permits and operating licenses for a period of 40 years authorizing The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company to construct and operate the utilization facility described in Item 5 below.

4. Additional Licenses Requested

Applicants request such additional source, special nuclear, and byproduct material licenses as may be necessary and appropriate to the construction and operation of the facility.

5. Description and Use of Facility

The Perry Nuclear Power Plant Units 1 & 2 will be a nuclear electric generating plant with boiling water reactor generating systems, utilizing the Mark III containment and BVR/6 design. The rated core thermal power of each unit will be 3579 Mwt with a design power of J758 Mwt. All safety evaluations in the PSAR are made at 3758 Mwt. The corresponding unit net electrical outputs will be 1205 Mwe and 1265 Mwe. The Perry Nuclear Power Plant Units 1 & 2 are to be located near Lake Erie in Lake County, Chio. The plant site is approximately 35 miles northeast of Cleveland, Chio, and 21 miles southwest of Ashtabula, Obio.

Details concerning the plant and the site are contained in the Preliminary Safety Analysis Report (PSAR) which constitutes a part of this application.

6. Financial Qualifications

The companies will share all expenditures for the decign, installation, construction, operation and maintenance of the plant, and in the energy production, in proportion to their undivided ownership interests therein, except that adjustments appropriate to any particular kind of expense may be made. All financing will be provided by the applicants. For example, sharing of operation and maintenance costs, including fuel, will be adjusted when full entitlement to the capability and output of the plant is not taken by any tenant in common therein.

a. Estimate of Construction Costs

The cost estimate is listed by Federal Power Commission accounts where applicable. The basis for the estimate are contract prices, with estimated escalation, for the nuclear steam supply system, turbine-generator and fabrication of the initial core, and an estimate of all other construction costs by The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company and Gilbert Associates, the Company's Architect/Engineer. This estimate includes interest during construction and all other construction costs. The interest rate used in computing interest during construction for each applicant is as follows:

#### b. Source of Construction Funds

Construction of the Perry Nuclear Power Plant will be financed as an integral part of the total construction programs of the five companies in the same general manner as other additions to their generating facilities. The companies would expect to derive funds from both internal and external sources. External sources would be satisfied by issuing first mortgage bonds, preferred stock and common stock.

The scheduled earliest completion date for Unit 1 is April 1981 and the latest completion date is December 1982. For Unit 2 the corresponding dates are October 1982 and June, 1984.

One or more regulatory agencies and municipalities may have jurisdiction over the respective rates and services of the Applicants incident to the generation and distribution of electric energy from the utilization facility for which a class 103 license is requested herein. Applicants agree that they will not permit any individual to have access to Restricted Data until the Civil Service Commission shall have made an investigation and a report to the Atomic Energy Commission on the character, associations, and loyalty of such individual, and the Atomic Energy Commission shall have determined that permitting such person to have access to Restricted Data will not endanger the common defense and security.
