

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF  
THE WEST COVINA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

WHEREAS, the West Covina Chamber of Commerce is vitally concerned that the economic, environmental and social well-being of the State of California be maintained; and

WHEREAS, an adequate supply of energy is critical to meeting California's economic and social needs while preserving the environmental gains of the past decade; and

WHEREAS, this nation's continued overdependence of foreign oil has caused major adverse economic impacts; and

WHEREAS, there is a probability that instability in the Middle East will, at some near future time, result in reduced supplies of oil, thereby causing further social and economic chaos here at home; and

WHEREAS, there must be a strong commitment to conservation of the nation's limited resources and development of efficient and secure new sources of energy here at home; and

WHEREAS, regulatory delays in the planning and licensing of needed energy facilities are costly to the consumer, damaging to the environment, and result in greater importation of foreign oil;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the West Covina Chamber of Commerce supports:

- licensing San Onofre Units II and III and the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plants;
- developing alternative forms of energy such as, solar, geothermal, and wind;

San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 & 3

The Watson Refinery of ARCO Petroleum Products Company in Carson, California respectfully submits this letter expressing its interest in the licensing of San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3.


The Watson Refinery is one of Southern California Edison Company's largest customers. Since they are our sole supplier, their ability to supply reliable, reasonably priced electric energy is of critical importance to our operation.

It is our understanding that San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3 are essential to Southern California Edison's program to meet these criteria for all of their customers. We believe that a major block of nuclear generating capacity will give their system diversification which will help insure reliability and stabilize generating costs.

The Watson Refinery purchases 60 KVA electricity while producing gasoline, jet fuels, diesel fuel, petrochemicals, low sulfur fuel oil and petroleum coke. Although the process units have spare steam driven equipment to allow the units to safely shut down in the event of a power interruption, they cannot maintain production without a continuous electric supply from the Southern California Edison system.

We do therefore urge the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Atomic Safety and Licensing Board to expeditiously process the operating licenses for San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3.
