NOTIFICATION OF NONCOMPLIANCE WITH EFFLUENT LIMITATIONS - NPDES PLEMIT NO. TN0026450 - SEQUOYAH NUCLEAR PLANT

Description of the discharge-Discharge No. 019 - Service Ruilding Sump Discharge. A sample collected and analyzed on August 17, 1981 contained 286 mg/l of suspended solids, exceeding the maximum permit limitation of 100 mg/l.

Steps taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncomplying discharge—The sump was cleaned on August 17, 1981 to end this period of noncompliance. As an interim corrective measure, the sump cleaning requency will be increased to twice a month. As a longterm corrective measure, a Design Charge Request has been issued to reroute this waste stream to the operational sewage treatment plant (discharge 003), which will provide additional treatment for this waste stream.
