ANSWER OF MARY ELLEN SALAVA TO NRC STAFF INTERROGATORIES
AND REDUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS

The intervenor, Mary Ellen Salava, being first duly sworn states under oath as follows:

The following are my answers to the NRC Staff Interrogatories and Request for Production of Documents to Wanda Christy; Mary Ellen Salava and Kansans for Sensible Energy (KASE), dated August 14, 1981:

1. (a) Our contention is that the local governments (Coffey County, the State of Kansas, and other local units of government required to respond to an emergency at the Wolf Creek plant) do not have a workable evacuation plan. To date, none of these units of government has prepared a plan. Even though a plan has not been prepared, discussions I have had with County Commissioners, representatives of the State of Kansas, and others indicate that plans being contemplated cannot be

implemented because there are not enough people available to fill the positions required for the evacuation plan. Additionally, there is no evidence that governmental units are providing adequate training to people who might be involved in implementing an evacuation plan. There is no indication that such units of government have the equipment needed to implement such an evacuation plan. None of the units of government required to respond to an accident at the Wolf Creek plant and provide for the evacuation of people affected thereby has provided for any funding to carry out such an evacuation plan. Until plans are prepared and submitted, there is no evidence that a viable evacuation plan exists. Until such plans are submitted, I cannot adequately respond to this Interrogatory. However, once the plans are submitted, I will respond as requested.

(b) Until the plans of the local units of government and the state are submitted, I am not able to answer this interrogatory. At this time, we have not decided upon who will be called as a witness. However, as soon as witnesses are decided upon, the NRC Staff will be notified and furnished with the information requested in Interrogatories 1(b), 1(c), 1(d), 2 and 3.

The answers set forth above on pages 1 to 2 are based on the information available to me at this time. If further information becomes available to me, I reserve the right to s, plement or amend these answers and to the extent required to do so will supplement or amend these answers.
