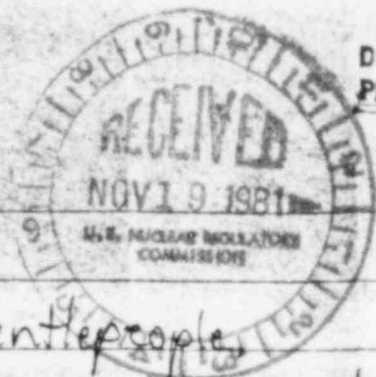

I write to express some thoughts and feelings about Diablo Canyon and the NRC's regulation and role in it's situation. I ask that you be more aware of the serrouness of the recently-disclosed problems at the plant. It is difficult for the "non-expert" people to feel trust for you and the PG&E officials, as you both tell different stories about the same incidents. Why do you not co-operate in creating safer electrical generation systems? Does either party really expect to safely operate the plant, "dispose" its wastes, decommission* it, and guard the remnants for thousands of years?

Please take this opportunity, knowing our support, to seriously reevaluate the sensibility of Diablo Canyon as a nuclear facility. We are fortunate in being given such a chance to really study the plant and more sane alternatives for it's use.

Dear Sir:

With serious defects revealed (and others which may not yet be apparent) in the construction of the Diablo Nuclear Power Plant, I am shocked that their license for low power testing remains in effect. The PG&E proposal for an expert to scrutinize the plans does not take into account blunders which may have occurred when the plans presumably were being followed. Only a physical inspection could do this.

If the NRC is not to re-enact another Three Mile Island, real REGULATION is necessary. Much at Diablo has been glossed over, is left undone and unaccounted for. Reconsideration of the wisdom of locating a nuclear plant next to an earthquake fault, for one thing, and revocation of the low-power test license for another, are a beginning for the NRC.
