In its motion NRC Staff notes that in the event that the licensee does not respond to the subject motion, or that if it fails to comply with the scheduling order, it will move for the entry of an order dismissing this proceeding.

The Licensing Board has had jurisdiction over this proceeding since September 26, 1989 when it was established. A reasonable time has elapsed so that the proceeding should be gotten underway. Staff's proposed schedule is a reasonable one. All Chemical Isotope Enrichment, Inc., has not chosen to oppose it. On that basis the Licensing Board decides to make that proposed its scheduling order.

In entering this scheduling order, it is without prejudice to NRC Staff moving for the entry of an order seeking dismissal of this proceeding should there be a failure to respond to this order.
