SUBJECT: NORTH ANNA UNITS 1 AND 2 (NA-1&2) - RESPONSE TO NRC GENERIC LETTER 89-06 ON THE SAFETY PARAMETER DISPLAY SYSTEM (MPA F-072, TAC NOS. 73680 AND

73881)

NRC Generic Letter (GL) 89-06, dated April 12, 1989, requested you to provide certification regarding the implementation of a Safety Parameter Display System (SPDS) at your facility. The GL and its attachment, NUREG-1342, provided clarification of the requirements for an acceptable SPDS as originally defined in NUREG-0737, Supplement 1, issued January 1983. The GL further requested you to complete a checklist and take photographs of your SPDS and to retain these records for 3 years from the date of certification.

On August 8, 1989, Virginia Electric and Power Company certified that the SPDS at NA-1&2 will fully meet the requirements of NUREG-0737, Supplement 1, by December 31, 1990 taking into account the information provided in NUREG-1342. Based upon this certification, the NRC staff concludes that your facility will sat sfactorily meet all requirements for an SPDS specified in NUREG-0737, Supplement 1, provided that commitments for implementation are completed on schedule. Therefore, staff review of this issue is complete. The NRC should be notified if the proposed date of SPDS ful: implementation stated above is incorrect or revised. You should also notify the staff in writing upon full implementation of the SPDS at your facility. Please contact the NRC project manager if you have any questions.

This request is covered by Office of Management and Budget Clearance Number 3150-0011 which expires January 31, 1991. The estimaced average burden hours is 4 person hours per owner response for preparing the required letters. These estimated average burden hours pertain only to these identified responserelated matters and do not include the time for actual implementation of the requested actions.
