(Granting Joint Motion of USR Industries and Staff to Hold Proceeding in Abeyance)

Judge Shon for the majority:

On May 4 USk Industries and NRC Staff filed a Joint Motion of USR Industries and NRC Staff to hold the Proceeding in Abeyance (Motion). The Motion was accompanied by a Partial Interim Agreement Between USR Industries and the NRC Staff (Pgreement). On May 8 we held a conference between the Board and counsel to permit these parties to further clarify their positions and to present further argument as to whether the motion should be granted.

We grant the Motion for the reasons set forth below, but not without misgivings. Like our dissenting colleague we are in some measure reluctant to grant additional delay in this case. Its history has been one of repeated dilatory maneuvering, and indeed despite two orders from the Staff, one in March and one in August of last year, despite our lifting of our pendente lite stay almost three months ago, and despite the Appeal Board's sanction of our action, no real progress has been made toward trying the case or complying with the orders that engendered it.

Nevertheless, we appear to be confronted with a situation in which at least some small progress will be made toward characterizing the state of contamination of the Bloomsburg site if we grant this Motion, while if we do not do so much of the money available may well be eaten up by litigation. (Tr. 292, 306). On the principle that it is better to investigate than to litigate, we are persuaded that the proper course is to allow the delay and encourage the parties to proceed according to the terms of the Agreement, hiring competent consultants to probe the site to the extent that available funds will permit.

We recognize the hazard implicit in this course: We may arrive at the October deadline with the investigatory job only ten percent done (Tr. 264, 270, 271) and nothing else accomplished at all. We may then be confronted with a situation in which the case must still be tried, and both time and funds will have been expended to little avail. But we believe that the quality of the decision may well be

improved if all goes well. Both parties assure us that the data gathered over the next six months will improve the basis for and cogency of any decision we may later make.

(Tr. 327-331).

We are aware that on May 4 the Staff and USR Industries sent copies of their Motion and Agreement to the Appeal Board, suggesting in a cover letter that, should we grant the Motion, that action would delay the effects of the Appeal Board's orders concerning the payment schedule as well as the effects of our own orders. We do not, of course, know what action the Appeal Board may take in response, and if such action impacts the order we issue here, we may be constrained to reconsider. Nevertheless, in view of the parties' desire that we act expeditiously (Tr. 341), we are now granting the Motion without awaiting action by the Appeal Board.

The Motion is Granted.

OSCAY H. PATIS ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE Judge Miller, Dissenting:

I would not grant the Motion. This ostensibly expedited proceeding has already been subject to more delay than necessary. Adding to that delay buys nothing: The savings realized by avoiding a few depositions and a few days of hearing time are minuscule and will likely be expended anyhow at some later date. Neither of the movants could represent to us that the data to be gathered in the next few months are essential to the hearing (Tr. 326-7, 330-1).

While the Commission's policy is to encourage settlement, this so-called settlement is really no settlement at all; it is simply an agreement to further delay matters. Had it been arrived at a year ago, it might have been worthwhile. Even now, if the Staff and USR Industries truly wish to settle, they could arrive at a real agreement, one in which the Staff could use its power to modify its orders in such a way as to make a hearing unnecessary. (Tr. 331-2).

I would adhere to our established hearing schedule, a schedule which would doubtless have produced a decision before the delayed schedule will even start the hearing.
