Subject: Nuclear Energy Services, Danbury Connecticut

An inspection was conducted at Nuclear Energy Services (NES) on July 24, 1990, to review the concerns regarding unsafe practices that were outlined in your June 26, 1990 letter. A copy of the inspection report is attached for your information.

The inspectors interviewed licensee management and employees and toured the facility. No unsafe conditions were found and no violations were observed. The inspectors determined that the Radiation Safety Officer listed on the license still holds that position, that no radioactive materials were being stored at the licensee's facility, and several NRC Form 3 forms were posted with a statement informing workers where the NRC license and associated information could be found. The inspectors also determined that, to date, no licensed activities have been conducted under this license. The inspectors noted that all work conducted by NES involving licensed radioactive materials, has been performed under the authority of the NRC licenses issued to NES's customers.

Other allegations identified in your June 26, 1990, letter pertaining to destruction of QA Audits are currently being reviewed.

We appreciate your concerns and feel that we have taken the appropriate steps to investigate them. Should have additional questions, or if I can be of further assistance in this matter, please do not hesitate to contact me.
