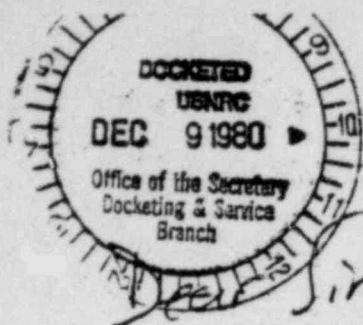

Sir:

I feel I must comment upon the release posted in the federal Register on October 27<sup>th</sup> of this year. This states a proposal to use contaminated scrap or waste metal from enrichment plants in a smelted form in the open marketplace as an alloy in automobiles, stensils, coms, etc. I feel ANY use of such material poses a health hazard that nobody could possibly predict over a long period of time. It's been stated that the level of radiation would be negligible.

In my opinion, there is no acceptable level of radiation other than that received by human beings in normal, natural environment. In the open air, free from the pollutants of an industrial society. We must move in other directions with our programs to provide energy and employment in this country. It will be a bigger mistake in the long run to pursue our present nuclear policy than to suffer the expense of changing now. I wholeheartedly oppose the proposal in the Register.
