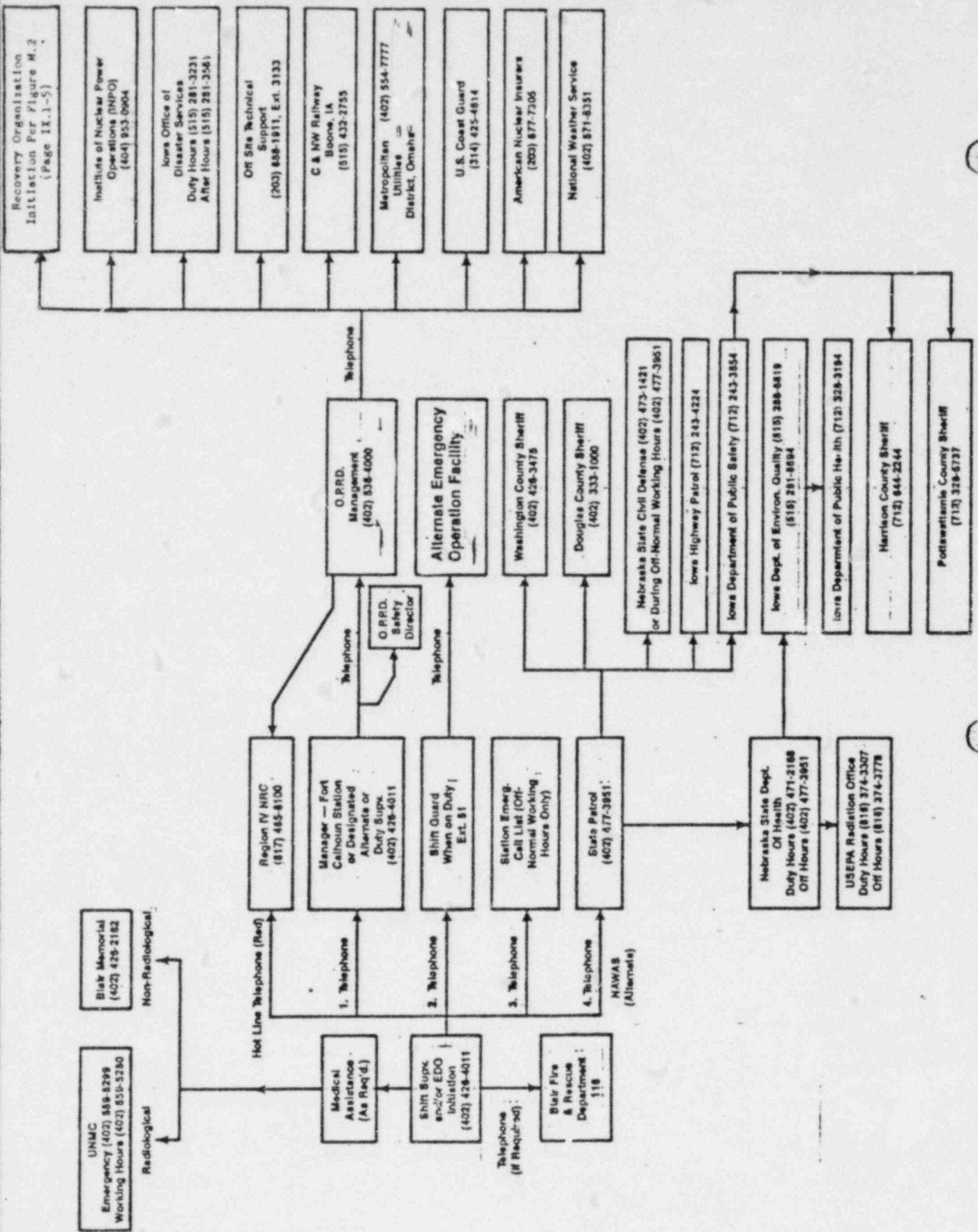

EMERGENCY OPERATION FACILITY
NOTIFICATION AND COMMUNICATION

I. PURPOSE

RE-ENTRY AND RECOVERY COMMUNICATION

I. PURPOSE

This communications facilities available for Re-entry and Recovery operations are identified and the procedure for proper use of these facilities is described. Utilization of these communication facilities will vary depending on the nature of the Re-entry and Recovery operation.
