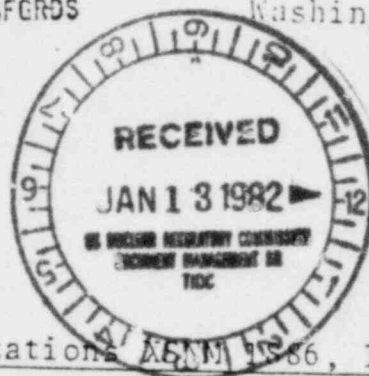

Re applications XSNM 1886, 1887 and 1888

Dear Mr Griffin:

I wish to refer to your letter of November 17, 1981 regarding three applications from Edlow International Company for licenses to export to ASEA-ATOM, Sweden, the following quantities:

XSNM 1886

max 102 000 kg U containing max 4 131 kg U-235

XSNM 1887

max 84 000 kg U containing max 3 402 kg U-235

XSNM 1888

max 96 000 kg U containing 3 888 kg U-235

In all these cases the material will be transferred to ASEA-ATOM in the form of Uraniumhexafluoride. ASEA-ATOM will use the material for the manufacturing of fuel elements for:

Oskarshamn II	replacement 8-12	(XSNM 1886)
Barsebäck I	" 7-9	(XSNM 1887)
Barsebäck II	" 5-7	(XSNM 1888)

I am now able to inform you that the above mentioned material will be subject to all terms and conditions of the US-Swedish agreement of cooperation regarding civil uses of atomic energy.

AB ASEA-ATOM, Oskarshamnsverkets Kraftgrupp AB and

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Sydskraft AB are authorized to receive and possess the material.


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We would appreciate it if you would send us copies of the export licenses when they are approved.
