At the pretrial on January 6, 1982, the Board inquired to the status of various actions required by the Pennsylvania rtment of Resources. At that time, I indicated that I had knowledge of matters disclosed to me by the Department which I did not feel free to communicate. Since that time, the Department has punced its decision to withdraw the water quality certification Section 401 issued in connection with the 404 permit determinately the Corps of Engineers regarding the Point Pleasant intakes. I inclose herewith a copy of DER's withdrawal letter.

Also, at the hearing, Philadelphia Electric was invited to submit copies of the DRBC rules applying to the matter of adjudicatory hearings, and also a copy of the unpublished Order of the Third Circuit regarding the NRC's prior decision.

Delaware has now reviewed the DRBC Rules and ascertained to reasons why no adjudicatory hearing was requested in connection with the February 18, 1981 final approval by the DRBC under Section 3.8 of its regulations. Those rules and regulations of DRBC make it clear that protestants have no right to request a hearing, and the question as to a scheduling of a hearing depends on the Executive Director's exercise of discretion (Section 2-3.10(a), pages 18 and 19). No provision is made for appeal to the Commission of a determination

by the Executive Director not to schedule a hearing. Nor do the provisions in Article 5 of the Rules relate to this matter, since it arises as a result of non-Section 3.8 proceedings.

Thus, while the DRBC has provision for hearings, such hearings, other than at the instance of the applicant, are completely discretionary with the Commission, and the failure of the Commission to hold such a hearing in this matter cannot certainly be considered a waiver or the equivalent of a hearing for purposes of this Board's action.

Dear 'r. Hosers:

The Popartment has determined that, pursuant to \$401 of the Federal Water Follution Control Act, 33 USC \$1341, we are obliged to publish, for public comment, notice of receipt of any application for cartification of any project requiring a Federal parallel pursuant to \$404 of the Federal Act, prior to taking action on the application. Since the Department did not publish notice that it had received the Authority's application for cartification dated May 11, 1921, we hereby withdraw the subsequent Popartment certification issued by letter dated August 14, 1931.

In the February 6, 1982 issue of the Pennsylvania Rulletin, the Department will publish notice that 1) on May 11, 1981, the Department received from the Authority en application for water quality certification pursuant to \$401 of the Federal Act, and 2) the Department has withdrawn its August 14, 1981 certification and will reconsider the Authority's application in light of all comments received within thirty (30) days after publication of notice.

This action of the Department may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Doard, First Floor Annex, Blackstone Building, 112 Market Street, Marrishurg, 2A 17120, (717) 787-3483, by any apprieved person pursuant to Section 1921-A of the Administrative Code of 1929, 71 ?.S. §510-21; and the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa. C.S. Chapter SA. Appeals must be filled with the Environmental Mearing Board within 30 days of receipt of written notice of this action unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. Copies of the appeal form and the regulations governing practice and procedure before the Board may be obtained from the Board.
