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

The Rancho Seco ASLAB, in their memorandum and Order dated October 7, 1981, required the staff's review of your HPI nozzle analysis. As part of this review, we requested additional information in our February 3, 1982 letter. In response to our letter, your February 4, 1982 letter indicated that no additional thermal cycling of the normal make-up nozzle is expected as a result of manually actuated HPI. You subsequently told us by elephone on February 8, 1982 that the source of HPI water when actuated manually is the make-up tank instead of the borated water storage tank normally used for the automatically actuated HPI. In support of the information given to us verbally, please give us a copy of your procedure for manually initiating HPI after a reactor trip. We request your submittal within 15 days of receipt of this letter.

The reporting and/or recordkeeping requirements contained in this letter affect fewer than ten respondents; therefore OMB clearance is not required under P.L. 96-511.
