

Dear Sir:

This is in response to your letter of April 6, 1990 citing apparent violations of License Condition 16, 13.A.(1), 14 and the maintenance of personnel dosimetry records for 1988. The corrective actions that have been taken will be listed in the order in which the APPENDIX categorizes the violations.

1. The Victoreen Survey Meter has been calibrated and is now operable. Arrangements have been made to receive this service from the Brown County Civil Defense Director each year.

2. A better system has been initiated for maintaining leak test records in conjunction with inventory control of the various nuclear devices. All equipment has been factory repaired or tested for leakage within the last three months.

3. Covered in 2. above.

4. We have applied for a supplemental personnel dosimetry report for 1988 from our servicing vendor. We expect to have this report within 30 days.
